Course Objectives

This course will provide a review of the current state-of-the-art management strategies and innovations in the management of head and neck cancer. As the course will be based on a multidisciplinary approach to these challenging disease processes, with representative faculty from Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery, Medical Oncology and Radiation Oncology, the educational focus will be directed at practitioners and trainees from all these specialties. Participants will be presented the latest medical and surgical evaluation and treatment algorithms by national and world leaders in the care of head and neck cancers.
